Order Amending Indiana Administrative Rules

Under the authority vested in this Court to provide by rule for the procedure employed in all courts of this state and this Court's inherent authority to supervise the administration of all courts of this state, the Indiana Administrative Rules are amended as follows (deletions shown by striking and new text shown by underlining):

Rule 1. Preparation and Filing of Statistical Reports

. . .

(G) Reporting of Decision Point Data in Juvenile Cases

- (1) Disproportionate Minority Contact (DMC)/Juvenile Decision Point Data Report. Trial courts hearing juvenile delinquency cases shall electronically compile and report DMC data for all delinquency cases in their court. The Division of State Court Administration (Division) shall draft and distribute procedures for and assist courts in the gathering and electronic submission of statistical data and reports.
- (2) Reporting Periods. The last day of the reporting period for quarterly reports shall be December 31, March 31, June 30 and September 30. Beginning in federal fiscal year (October 1, 2016 September 30, 2017) the judge of a trial court subject to this rule shall cause the quarterly reports to be filed with the Division within ten (10) calendar days after the end of the reporting period in an electronic format as established by the Division.
- (3) Information for Reports. The judge of a trial court, subject to this rule, may require clerks, court reporters, probation officers, or any employee of the court to furnish information required to complete and prepare the reports.

(4) Judge's Confirmation of Reporting. The Judge of a Court or Chief Judge of a unified Court system shall review all reports and confirm through a process established by the Division of State Court Administration the completion and filing of all reports.

These amendments shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
